

**Supplemental Educational Services (Tutoring Programs)**  
**Pageland Elementary School**  
**2011-2012**

According to the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, students receiving **free or reduced lunch** who attend Title I schools that have not made adequate yearly progress (AYP) for three consecutive years (referred to as schools in continuing school improvement, corrective action, planning to restructure, or restructuring) must be offered the opportunity to receive supplemental educational services (SES). Your child's school has been identified because Pageland Elementary has been in school improvement for at least four consecutive years. SES is after school extra academic assistance (tutoring) that is designed to help children improve academic performance – at no cost to the parents. If you choose for your child to participate, you will be able to select a program that best fits your child's needs. This notice is being provided to help you understand how SES can help your child and what you must do to take advantage of it.

One of the most important features of SES is that the parents are the ones who will make choices for their children. You will be able to choose among different types of services, given by different providers. You can decide what is best for your child. Even though SES is being offered, parents are under no obligation to enroll their child in SES.

Parents are invited to attend a Provider Fair for Pageland Elementary which will be held from 4:00 to 6:00 on Wednesday, September 28. All providers have been invited to be present at this meeting to discuss the services they have to offer. You will have the opportunity to ask questions and talk with the providers who attend the fair. If you are unable to attend this provider fair and would like to attend one, you may choose to attend one at Cheraw Intermediate School on September 27 from 5:00 until 7:00.

Please read the following information that has been provided by the SES providers that will be offering services in Chesterfield County School District. If interested, please complete the attached enrollment form and return as indicated below.

Due to limited spaces in the SES program, we may not be able to enroll every child whose parent applies. If you decide you want to enroll your child in the SES program, you must return the attached form to your child's school or send to the Title I office. We will accept applications until November 11. **However, priority will be given to applications received by October 21, 2011.** It is possible that we will have more applications by the priority deadline than space available. A second priority system will be implemented in the event this happens. If we do not receive a form from you on or before the November date, your child will not be able to participate in the SES for the first term this year. A notice will be sent home with your child once the application is submitted. This will serve to let you know the Title I office has received your application. If we are unable to serve your child at this time, his/her name will be placed on a waiting list. There will be a second term of sessions next semester. Those students on the waiting list will have priority over new applications.

Transportation to and from SES is the responsibility of the parent.

We will notify you early in November to inform you whether or not your application has been approved for SES services. Please remember that approval is based on funds available and the number of applications we receive.
